Dear Parents and Carers

Well the cold weather has certainly made its presence felt over the last week or so. It is important that students are dressed appropriately for the cold weather and at this time of year students are able to wear beanies if they so desire. We have entered the 'Hats Off' period, where we do not enforce the schools 'No Hat No Play' rule. This is because the UV levels drop to under 3 during this time of year and assists children to get exposure to Vitamin D. Sun Smart hats will be required to be worn again at the beginning of August.

Last week our school captains acted as the Principal for a day. Spotlight on Learning! Specialist Programs

Environmental Science

Students this term have learnt about Energy and how it is an essential resource. They are learning about renewable and non-renewable energies and how human consumption has a major effect upon energy resources. The next step in our program is to look at how we can reduce our energy consumption and lessen the impact this has on our environment.





Indonesian

Students this term have been focusing on a range of literacy text types using Indonesian for a range of purposes. Year 5 and 6 students have been writing children's storybooks about imaginary families. Year 3 and 4 students have been writing letters to friends about foods they like and don't like. While students in Kindergarten to Year 2 have been preparing puppet plays about an imaginary group of friends going to school. This has been lots of fun for all ages, along with a strong literacy focus and support for building the school's word conscious culture.

Music

There's plenty of excitement in the music program at Ngunnawal Primary School.

Kindergarten

Students have been learning how to play the djembe drum and can now play a simple rhythm. They have also enjoyed using our new Boomwhackers!

Years 1 and 2

Classes have been learning about the Angklung – a traditional Indonesian instrument made out of bamboo! Students have continued developing their skills on the djembe drum and have incorporated the recorder in simple melodies.

Years 3 and 4

Students have been developing their skills on the ukulele and are now playing 4 note melodies. They are focusing on reading music and understanding different music notation symbols.

Years 5 and 6

Classes are finishing their guitar learning by writing their own song and performing it for the class. Students will also have an opportunity in weeks 8 and 9 to show their skills during 'Music Show and Tell'. This is a time put aside during music sessions for students who come prepared with an extra musical item -whether it be on a band instrument, piano, voice or any other instrument they may be learning at home, to perform for the class.

<u>Limelight</u>

The Limelight group for 2018 has been selected after 2 weeks of auditions. Students involved met for the first time last Friday to find out about our showcase feature act. Limelight rehearsal will take place 2-3pm each Friday afternoon.

Public Education Week celebrations.

Well done to students in the Year 5 and Year 6 bands who played in the courtyard for Public Education Week last Thursday. It was great to have so much music in the courtyard for all to see!

A big thank you to those students who performed during the Art Show. We had performances on the piano, violin, saxophone, flute and bass clarinet. It was inspiring to see you perform!



Physical Education and Health

All students in PE this term will have had the opportunity to participate in dancing and Aboriginal Games. Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 learnt the Chicken Dance and the Macarena and participated in Every Chance to Dance. Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 learnt the Cha Cha Slide and Heel Toe Polka. All year groups have been learning different types of Aboriginal games and in particular Buroinjin.





In Health, all year groups have explored the concept of Sportsmanship. Students were engaged in this topic and a lot of students were able to use their experiences as examples. Each class made a set of sportsmanship rules that will be used for the rest of the year. This will be an ongoing topic throughout the year for all students.
