
PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to week seven. I am constantly amazed at how quickly the time flies by. We will be at the end of the term before we know it!

We are looking forward to our Athletics Carnival tomorrow, however if the weather is as it is today we will postpone it and it will be school as normal. If we do postpone the carnival we will post a message at 8.30am on the school's Facebook page advising that it has been called off. Details about the rescheduling will be sent out to families on Thursday this week.

At Ngunnawal Primary School we are working on implementing our goal to improve spelling for all kindergarten to year six students. To really highlight this focus we are working on building a word conscious culture by having an explicit print and word rich environment in all classes. When visiting classrooms you will see this in a variety of ways such as: *Word Walls*, *Word of The Week* displays, teacher *Hot Reads*, and student's writing. Bella and Kalani from 3/4TT, have used their learning about using strong words to write a



persuasive argument about a topic they are

passionate about. Bella wrote about looking after our environment and Kalani about the need to help homeless people. Congratulations to both students for demonstrating your learning in such a thoughtful and powerful way.

Thank you to the members of our community who drive their children to and from school. Your patience and efforts over the last two weeks to exercise caution during the peak periods in the school's carpark and surrounding areas, has certainly been noticed. We have seen a decrease in incidents of people parking in areas that obscure footpaths and parking or leaving cars unattended in the school set down and pick up area. 
Spotlight on Learning!

Spelling


Year 1/2 have been exploring words with the short E and long E sounds during our spelling lessons. Students have been participating in activities including magnet letters and rainbow writing to spell their words.

During other lessons, including silent reading, students are encouraged to find words with these spelling patterns and add them to the chart.



Shape

We have begun looking at shapes in Maths. Students have been using their prior knowledge to hunt for shapes in the classroom and playground. We have also been experimenting with them by making pictures using a variety of shapes. In lessons we will build on this knowledge of 2D shapes and will explore 3D objects.




Reconciliation Week



This term students have been learning about the reading strategy of summarising. Students have been learning to find key words and the main ideas from the text to summarise their reading. Students have shown enjoyment in reading a variety of texts and summarising them using graphic organisers to draw and write the key information in their own words. A summarised story wheel about the book 'Hanukkah in Alaska' was created below by students.
