Toys

Often children like to bring toys to school, however I must remind everyone that the school cannot take any responsibility for them if they are lost, damaged or stolen. I encourage that all precious toys and valuable items be left at home. If your child needs to have a special toy that helps them relax please discuss this with your child's teacher. We understand that a range of resources, that sometimes look like toys, are used to calm and reduce anxiety in children. All students should have access to a calming spot (tent), where they can have some quiet calming time and may use a sensory toy to further calm and reduce their anxiety. These resources are extremely valuable, especially with our younger students who we work closely with as they learn to self-regulate their emotions. If you have any questions about this, please make a time to speak with your child's teacher.

Spotlight on Learning!


Yerrabi

questions.




Kindergarten continues to use the **Friendly Schools Plus** alongside quality literature develop social skills and talk about feelings and emotions.
