



Spotlight on Learning!

Budawang

The children have returned to school with wonderful enthusiasm. We have a busy term ahead and have been settling quickly back into our routines. We are very excited to be able to play on the oval at recess and lunch times along with the rest of the school.

In **English** students have been participating in recount writing. Students sit with a partner to talk about their weekend, including information about who? what? when? and where? After sharing and listening they write their stories on a whiteboard and include a picture. We also use stories as stimulus for our writing. After reading the story The Farmacy Cat by Christine Anello we were able to write about the animals in the story using finger spaces, beginning sounds and a full-stop.



During weekly **Friendly School** lessons students have been learning about different emotions and how they make us feel. Students have been practising strategies to use when they are feeling sad or angry. We have discussed how we can identify emotions through our facial expressions.



Kindergarten have been busy learning about letters and the sounds they make. Each week we have been focusing on 2 letters. Students brainstorm all the different words they know with each sound. Students often create artwork to represent their learning.



Not only have we been enjoying the oval during play times, during **Physical Education** we have also been out there with our classes practising for the Cross Country race.





This year's theme, **Soaring**, encourages participants to explore one of the multiple meanings this work evokes - from the feelings of joy and exhilaration, to stories of human endeavour, to the world of nature, to the world of space.



ThinkUKnow Presentation

Ngunnawal Primary School will be hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation on **Tuesday 7 May 2019 at 6pm in the School Library**, and all parents, carers and teachers are encouraged to attend.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a cyber safety education program that educates parents, carers and teachers of how people are using technology, the challenges they may face online, and how to help them overcome these in a safe and ethical way.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation covers issues relating to children and young peoples' privacy and security online, their relationships with other users and their online reputation. It provides insight into the devices young people are using, as well as the popular websites, apps and social networking sites they're accessing.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology.

ParentLink provides parenting education to the community, from birth to teenage years. It is available for parents, carers, kin, teachers, and the broader community, providing information and links to local resources and services.


The ParentLink website provides links to all ParentLink guides including a variety of topics - *Starting School, More than Reading and Writing, Optimism and Cyber Safety*.
